SUBSTITUTE SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS NEEDED

Linn County R-I is in need of substitute bus drivers. If you are aware of anyone that would be of interest please have them contact Mr. Brinkley at 244-5045.

Substitute drivers are paid based upon the number of times that they drive a bus. While the frequency of driving can vary, it is a nice additional source of income that works well for farmers, stay at home mom's, and self-employed individuals who are free to drive on a flexible schedule.

Substitute bus drivers are typically the first in line when a new permanent bus driver is hired. So being a substitute driver can lead to a more permanent position if desired. Drivers must be 21 years of age, and be able to receive a CDL license with the Class "S" endorsement, and pass a physical examination. The district will reimburse individuals for the time related to taking the driving test, will pay for the costs of the driving test, the criminal background check and the physical, In addition the district will provide assistance in studying for the driving test.

A school bus driver has a unique relationship with the students. It is an important responsible position that can not be left to just anyone. We need strong community members to help in this important educational role. For application or more information call 244-5045.





FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM

One of the strongest programs of the federal government is the Free & Reduced Price Lunch Program. It has been in place for many years, and has benefited a large number of students by guaranteeing them a good meal at breakfast and lunch. It has provided parents peace of mind, since they know their child is being provided a good meal at breakfast and lunch.

One of the little known aspects of the Free & Reduced Price Lunch Program is how it helps farmers by helping to keep farm prices high. The Program started originally as a program to help farmers, and it has been very effective. It is still directed by the department of agriculture, and highly supported by agriculture organizations.

With recent changes in the way money is distributed to the schools the program is especially valuable to Linn R-I. Several large sums of money distributed by the state and federal government are directly tied to the number of students in the school that qualify for free or reduced lunches. With the new method of determining distribution of state money, the more students that sign up for the lunch program the more money the school district receives. Currently, besides the reimbursement we get for the meals that are served under the Free & Reduced Price Lunch Program, Linn R-I gets almost \$700.00 per student that qualifies for Free/Reduced lunches. That money can be spent to pay for educating the students, and directly replaces money that would otherwise have to be collected in the form of taxes. So if you qualify for this program we urge you to sign up. It helps your child and it helps the district.

Qualification is based upon family income. If you are now receiving food stamps or Temporary Assistance for your child, your child may receive free meals. If your total household income is the same or less than the amounts listed on the Income Chart below, your child my receive free or reduced price meals. A foster child may receive free or reduced price meals regardless of your income. Currently the Maximum income per family is:


