



History

Freshman Government is getting a history lesson on the development of the Constitution as well as the great men who developed the document. They are beginning to see the documents that formed the Constitution and will discover the components that make up this great document. The class will be visiting the Capital later on next month if the weather holds up.

World History is making its way into the explorers. The class is currently researching different explorers and the countries they represented in the 16th century. They will be producing posters to show who they sailed for, where they went and who were these explorers and what made them the persons they were.

Psychology is discovering the parts of the brain. Although they would like to dissect a brain we will be looking at models that show the brains structure and how we retain memory. This is a fun class that in its self is made up of several age groups that like to analyze data.

8th grade American History is going west. This class has sprung forward in learning about the Louisiana Purchase and the pioneers who settled the plains. They are discovering the leaders that promoted this expansion and some of the unfair treatment of the Native Americans forced off their land. They are currently going over the Trail of Tears and finding that even though the Supreme Court ruled in favor of the Cherokee nation the government ignored their rights and made them move to Oklahoma.

Geography is moving forward after a long week with the countries in Eastern Europe. They are ready to move in to Northern Africa and the countries surrounding the Mediterranean Sea. With the troops in Afghanistan and Iraq the interest has been better in countries they hear about often in the news.

11th grade American History is just finishing World War II and discovering about the Holocaust and Pear Harbor. Even though they had heard about this war they are digging in to find out more information that is not covered in the book by doing reports on individuals that were there. Hopefully by doing this they will understand that common everyday people were affected in this war and they stepped up and took pride in helping others.

I would like to pass on to you the new vaccination requirements so that you will have time to get the needed vaccinations for your child prior to the 2010-2011 school year.

New Immunization Requirements for 2010-2011 School Year.

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services recently revised the Code of State Regulations, Immunization Requirements for School Children. These rules establish the minimum requirements for children enrolled in Missouri public, private, and parochial schools, day cares, preschools, or nursery schools. These revisions include:

ATTENTION ALL PARENTS OF STUDENTS ENTERING KINDERGARTEN

Second dose of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine for all children entering kindergarten. If the kindergarten child has had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of the previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease will no longer be accepted beginning with the 2010-2011 school year for children entering kindergarten.

This rule change applies to children entering kindergarten and thereafter. For children enrolled in grades one through five, only one dose of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is required. Parental or guardian statesments of disease continue to be acceptable.

ATTENTION ALL PARENTS OF INCOMING 8TH GRADERS

Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough)) vaccine will be required for all incoming eighth (8th) grade students if the child has completed the recommended child-hood DtaP/DTP vaccination series and has not received a Td Booster within the past two years.

For children enrolled in grades 9-12 who have not received a single dose of Td, it is highly recommended they receive a single dose of Tdap as their catch-up booster instead of Td or receive one dose of Tdap two years after the last Td dose.

(This will help prevent an outbreak of whooping cough in the high school students.)

PRESCHOOL

Effective July 1, 2010 the following new requirements will be implemented:

1. Age appropriate pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) for children attending preschool.

2. For all children who have had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine (MD) or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the child care facility a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease will no longer be acceptable beginning July 1, 2010.

UPCOMING ACT TEST DATE HELD AT LINN COUNTY

The next ACT test date is scheduled for Saturday. April 10th. Again this year grades 9th and 12th will be required to take the ACT in April free of charge. The ACT test will be given at the Linn County R-I School in April. Freshmen and seniors will be filling out their ACT Registration Packets at school. Sophomores and juniors are encouraged to sign up on their own to take the ACT at Linn County in April. However, sophomores and juniors will be responsible for their registration fee. Applications must be submitted by March 5th to avoid late fee registration. If your student has not picked up a Registration Packet they can register Online. However, online registrations must be paid by MasterCard or VISA. I would also like to point out, when filling out the registration folder, in section L you need to place Linn County R-I High School Code: 260-370.

FAFSA ~ FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

As of January 1st senior students/parents may submit their FAFSA applications. The FAFSA applications can be filled out online. In order to do this you will need to apply for an electronic PIN number. To receive a PIN and fill out the FAFSA application, go to www.fafsa.ed.gov. You will use your 2009 income information to complete the 2010-2011 FAFSA. You must complete this application to receive A+ assistance. It is suggested to begin a FAFSA file folder somewhere safe; each year you will need to renew the FAFSA application. If you have any questions please feel free to call me.

END OF COURSE EXAMS

I would like to take this time to remind parents of a letter that was sent home at the beginning of the school year. The End-of-Course assessments will be given at the end of the following courses: Algebra I. Geometry, Algebra II. English I. English II. Government, American History and Biology. A student who completes a course or sequence of courses incorporating the content of the Course-Level Expectations will be required to take the corresponding End-of-Course exam.

The Algebra I. English II and Biology exams will include one section consisting of multiple-choice items and one section with a performance event (Algebra I and Biology) or writing prompt (English II). A student's raw score on selected-response items combined with his/her score on open-ended items, will contribute to 10% of that student's course grade. All other EOC exams consist of only multiple choice items which will then contribute to 10% of that student's course grade.
