Academic Awards Ceremony





News From the Nurse

I would like to remind you of the vaccination requirements so that you will have time to get the needed vaccinations for your child prior to the 2011-2012 school year.

Immunization Requirements for 2011-2012 School Year.

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services recently revised the Code of State Regulations, Immunization Requirements for School Children. These rules establish the minimum requirements for children enrolled in Missouri public, private, and parochial schools, day cares, preschools, or nursery schools. These revisions include:

STUDENTS ENTERING KINDERGARTEN

Second dose of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine for all children entering kindergarten.

If the kindergarten child has had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of the previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease will no longer be accepted beginning with the 2010-2011 school year for children entering kindergarten.

This rule change applies to children entering kindergarten and thereafter. For children enrolled in grades one through five, only one dose of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is required. Parental or guardian statesments of disease continue to be acceptable.

ATTENTION ALL INCOMING 8TH GRADERS

Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough)) vaccine will be required for all incoming eighth (8th) grade students if the child has completed the recommended childhood DtaP/DTP vaccination series and has not received a Td Booster within the past two years. All 8th grade students need this vaccination prior to the first day of school. Please bring the student's immunization record or proof of Tdap prior to or during enrollment.

For children enrolled in grades 9-12 who have not received a single dose of Td, it is highly recommended they receive a single dose of Tdap as their catch-up booster instead of Td or receive one dose of Tdap two years after the last Td dose.

(This will help prevent an outbreak of whooping cough in the high school students.)

PRESCHOOL

Effective July 1, 2010 the following new requirements were implemented:\

- 1. Age appropriate pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) for children attending preschool.
- 2. For all children who have had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine (MD) or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the child care facility a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease will no longer be acceptable beginning July 1, 2010.

Linn County R-I Ag Program/FFA News

The first few months of 2011 have been very busy for the students in the Linn County R-1 agriculture education program. In January students worked hard to close out the 2010 year records in their recordbooks and a several seniors were filling out their State FFA Degree Applications. Just like any company, business, farmer, or individuals close out their books for the year and begin to get ready for filing for taxes, the students in the agriculture education program do the same. Whether the students have jobs in the home or outside the home, own animals, crops, their own lawn mowing business, etc, they can use the records they keep throughout the year to help them prepare for and in the process of filing taxes. Others, who do not make enough to file, will look back on the year to determine if they made money, broke even or went into debt and then plan for improvements over the next year.

In February students were filing out proficiency award applications and starting to prepare for contest and TSA season. Five proficiency applications went on to the Area III Proficiency selection. Our students did a great job, proved successful and were rewarded at the Area III FFA Banquet and State FFA Convention.

Some of you may be wondering what contest and TSA season is. These two events are very similar but have different purposes. CDEs (Career Development Events) and FFA Contests are used to test students skills and knowledge about different areas of agriculture, communication skills, and FFA. CDEs have also be demeaned by the State of Missouri as TSA (Technical Skills Attainment) tests. This is a state mandated standardized testing of all agriculture education students in their third and fourth agriculture education course. Students must test in the area they are studying in their agriculture education program. The scores they must earn have been set by the prior year's students at the State FFA CDEs and DESE. These are very similar to the EOCs that students take in core classes and a way for the state to collect data on the performance of agriculture education student progress. As with any new form of testing, there are kinks that are still being worked out. Other students in the agriculture education program also were tested using CDEs as end of unit exams or they were practicing and competing for a place on the Linn County R-1 FFA contest teams in an area they were interested.

The practice contests and TSA testing started the first part of March and ended at the end of March. The Linn County R-1 students attended the following in the following areas: Hamilton Practice Contest, March 4. Events attended were Forestry, FFA Knowledge, Livestock Judging, Farm Management. Brunswick Practice Contest/TSA site, March 11. Events attended were Poultry Judging, Meat Judging, Farm Management, Forestry, and Livestock Judging. NCMC Practice Contest/TSA site, March 17. Event attended were Dairy Foods, Forestry, Meat Judging, Poultry Judging, Farm Management. Schuyler County Practice Contest/TSA site, March 18. Events attended were Dairy Foods and Forestry. North Shelby Practice Contest/TSA site, March 23. Events attended Poultry Judging, Livestock Judging, Farm Management.

Students competed and were tested at each of these sites and those who had the top average scores were chosen to be on the Linn County R-1 FFA teams for the Northeast District CDEs, on March 30, 2011, in Columbia, MO. The following were the teams who competed at the NE District CDEs: Poultry – Elicya Florez, Mindy Hayes, Hannah Hoskins, Lauren Russell. Livestock – Brittni Buswell. Forestry – Bryar Bookout, Ty Stillwell, Derek Wilson, Lucas Woodside. Dairy Foods – Jeremy Frazier, Colton Hardy, Cheyenne McQueen. Farm Management – Kaitlin Liebhart, Arieal Rinehart, Alex Snyder, Hayley Wood.

Students who were selected to represent the Linn County R-1 FFA Chapter at the Area III and NE District FFA Contests include the following with their placing: Chapter Scrapbook – Arieal Rinehart and Brittni Buswell (Area contest only). FFA Knowledge Team: Mindy Hayes, Hannah Hoskins, and Lauren Russell. Placed 6th at Area III and advanced to NE District Contests. FFA Creed Speaking: Hannah Hoskins placed 2nd in Area III and advanced to NE District Contests. State FFA Officer Interview: Alex Snyder. The Area III Contests were on March 15 at Kirksville Middle School and NE District Contests were March 21 at Monroe City.

The students in the Linn County R-1 Agriculture Education Program and/or the FFA Chapter have worked very hard and I am very proud of each one of them. I look forward to working with all of them in years to come!

Linn Co. Agriculture Construction

The Linn County R-1 Agriculture Construction class has been busy this year. We started by learning about shop safety and the tools we would be using in the agriculture mechanics shop. The students learned about metal and its properties, as well as the process of arc welding, MIG welding, oxy-acetylene cutting and plasma cutting. They have build wood projects ranging from bookshelves to shop tables, as well as metal projects ranging from a mounting bracket to a greenhouse. A list of the projects the class has made include bookshelves for Linn County R-1 teachers, shelving, a metal deer feeder which has a barrel mounted on top, snow plow mounting bracket for a four wheeler, trapping snare posts, a box for the Linn County Spelling Bee words, a frame for a mural for the art department, modified a metal trailer gate, modified a metal four wheeler rack to fit a newer style, built and painted two shop tables, and are currently building a 10'x10' greenhouse, which they have designed. They also helped build props from the Linn County R-1 Elementary Christmas Program and the School Play this year. The students in the Linn County R-1 Agriculture Construction class have learned and demonstrated a broad knowledge and skills in the agricultural mechanics shop. The extended space that is provided by the new agriculture education building, has given the students more opportunity and more freedom to create, learn, and build projects. The last month and a half of school, the Agricultural Science I and Agricultural Science II classes will be in the agricultural mechanics shop. After passing their safety exams, each class will be instructed in either arc welding or MIG welding, along with measuring and cutting techniques. The Agricultural Science II class will be undertaking the task of building a 10'x6'4" utility trailer for their class project. The addition of the new agriculture building has made this year very exciting and eventful for the students in the Linn County R-1 Agriculture Education Program. Thank you to the community members who make it possible!

Linn Co. R-I Junior High Science Olympiad Team Wins 1st Place at Regional Tournament, Competes Well at State Meet on April 16

When Linn County's Junior High Science Olympiad team came away from the Regional Tournament held at Truman State University on February 19 with a third place trophy, they were happy to have advanced to the next level of competition, the State Tournament on the MU campus in April. After all when your team of 15 is comprised of a fourth of the Junior High student body, it tends to be hard to compete against schools that are twice your size like Paris who received 2nd and even 10 times your size like Moberly who received 1st place.

Now, imagine how that team felt when they discovered an error had been made in scoring and they hadn't won 3rd place. In fact they had earned 1st place. Science Olympiad is truly a team competition. With only one point separating 1st and 2nd, the 5 points earned by the lowest scoring member of the team was vitally important to the team win. Here's proof of what most of us have been told all our lives. Every person on a team is important. That and even a small school can compete if they're willing to work hard enough.

Competition at the Regional Tournament is tough, but only a shadow of what State is like, where there are no size-of-school distinctions and private schools are included in the 33 schools at the tournament. As the smallest school represented at the State Meet, Linn Co still brought back several top 20 finishes on April 16.
