The Mustang in front of the Linn County R-I School stands in memory of Harold Lee Foss. Mr. Foss served on the school board when Browning and other districts first reorganized. When the new school was built outside of Purdin, his dream was to have a Mustang

stand at the school. This dream came true for him when his memorial money was used to purchase the black Mustang that stands outside of the school today.

Harold and Lois Foss loved sports and even after their daughters graduated from Liberty High School in Browning, they continued to go to the games and support the school. They knew all the kids and were always present for school events.

Mr. Foss was a very good friend with Eldon Tietsort who coached the team 52 years ago that made it to the Final Four. Mr. Tietsort later became the superintendent of Linn County R-I and the gym was named in his honor.

(grade level for 2019-2020 school year)

Students attending Catapult/Regular Summer School in the morning will walk from Chillicothe Middle School to GRTS after lunch. They will walk back to Chillicothe Middle School at 2:50pm, or, with permission may walk home or be picked up at 3:00pm.

Students not attending Catapult/Regular Summer School will need to have their own transportation to and from the GRTS. There will be a limited number of students allowed in each of the Boot Camps, but there is also a minimum to be able to hold the camp. The sooner the enrollment form is sent back, the better the chance the student has to be in the class. Students that participate in GRTS boot camps (and attending summer school) will not be eligible for the Catapult attendance gift card.

EMS/FIRE Boot Camp

Students will receive educational learning experiences seeing how our local Fire Department and GRTS prepare and teach our local Fire and EMS personnel to perform their duties! Students will learn and participate in the following:

- 1) Basic First Aid
- 2) CPR
- 3) Basic and Advanced levels of pre-hospital medical care
- 4) Take a tour of an ambulance
- 5) Tour the local Fire Station and Fire Apparatus
- 6) Tour the local Fire Training Tower
- 7) Learn the use of Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus
- 8) Learn to use a Thermal Imaging Camera, and many other EMS/Fire related activities.

Beginning Game Design

In this six day class students will be given an introduction to the primary concepts of gaming, and an exploration of how these basic concepts affect the way gamers interact with our games. Students will learn ways to create and describe a game concept, and even given the chance to create their own. No prior programming knowledge is required. All experience levels welcome.

Welding Boot Camp

The welding program at GRTS will aide students in the knowledge and safe operation of the Gas Metal Arc Welding (GMAW) process and the Plasma Arc Cutting (PAC) process. Students will be engaged in designing their own artistic cut out on a piece of designated size material. Students will have fun getting to practice cutting different shapes from various thicknesses of metal with the plasma arc cutting torch. Students will then learn to assemble their own frame from small angle iron and weld it together with the gas metal arc welding process. They will learn to place their cutout in the frame and weld it in place.

During the process, we will discuss manufacturing and why there are steps involved in producing a project. This is a fun project and they get to keep theirs when complete.
