From the Library

Change in Math Trophies--

This year we will award Match trophies (small, medium large) for those elementary students who master 60, 80 and 100 Accelerated Math Objectives, respectively.

What is Accelerated Math? This program is from the same company (Renaissance Learning) that does Accelerated Reader book quizzing. Students are assigned math objectives (2-column addition, decimal conversion, counting by 5's, etc.). Pencil and paper practices are printed out, students do the problems, and scan their answers into a math reader, using a "bubble card." The answers go directly to the company's computer where they are scored and a new practice is automatically printed here at the school.

The computer keeps track of their correct and incorrect answers. When they have answered enough correct, consecutive answers, the teacher can print a test. Through the tests, students master the Missouri math objectives for their class level (also Common Core). They can receive a soda at lunch for every 10 they master. Trophies are awarded at the end of the year. Grades 2-5 participate in the trophies. This program is used in Grades 1-8, but is available through Calculus.

The beauty of this program is that students can forge ahead at their own pace, or review concepts that they are still struggling with. Students in grades 2-5 have Accelerated Reader "class" once a week in the elementary library. There are approximately 100-150 objectives per grade level that can be learned. Questions? Contact Mrs. Shanks. You can see your child's AR and Accelerated Math progress from the school home page under library. Log on with their log-in. They all know what that is.

LC FFA Week

Notes From The Nurse

Immunization Requirements for 2013-2014 School Year.

STUDENTS ENTERING KINDERGARTEN need a second dose of varicella

(chickenpox) vaccine.

If the kindergarten child has had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of the previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease will no longer be accepted. Please visit with your physician or the nurses at County Health to see if your child needs any of his/ her 4-6 year old immunizations.

PRESCHOOL Students will need:

1. Age appropriate pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) for children attending preschool.

2. For all children who have had varicella (chickenpox) disease, a licensed doctor of medicine (MD) or doctor of osteopathy (DO) may sign and place on file with the child care facility a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella disease as satisfactory evidence of having had the disease. Parental or guardian statements of disease has not been acceptable since July 1, 2010.

 All preschool students will need to be up-to-date with their immunizations and provide the school with record of proof of immunizations before being able to attend school.
Missouri Legislation requires that all children age 6 months to 6 years attending a licensed daycare or preschool program provide documentation of a **recent lead**

screening. This test must have been done within the last year. If a parent/guardian refuses to have the child tested, they must provide a written statement explaining why they do not want the child tested.

Attention All 7th Grade Students/ Incoming 8th graders

Tdap, which contains pertussis vaccine, is required for students enrolling in the eighth grade for the 2013-2014 school year. State health regulations dictate that students cannot attend school unless they are properly immunized and can provide satisfactory evidence of the immunization or unless they are exempted. Documentation of immunization must include month, day, and year of administration. There is no grace period for compliance to state requirements. If your child is not in compliance they will not be allowed to attend school in the fall. We need proof of immunization before school starts.

Linn Co. R-1 and the Linn Co. Health Department are working together and have scheduled a Immunization clinic for 7th graders. Linn Co. R-1 will take students by bus to Linn Co. Health Department the day of the immunization clinic on March 22, 2013. A consent form from Linn Co Health was sent home with students on January 18th and parents will need to complete the form and return it to the school prior to March 15th. If your student did not make it home with a form please call me and I will send another form home with your student.

Free Vision Screening

I am very happy to announce that the Linn Co. R-1 School is in the process of scheduling the free auto refractive vision screening for children 6 months to 6 years of age in our school district and includes our current students in Preschool, Kindergarten, and 1st grade. The Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation will be conducting the free screening. This screening involves taking a scan of your child's eyes with the Plus Optix auto refractor.

Auto refraction vision testing can detect the presence of six possible eye disorders, nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, anisometropia (equal refraction), strabismus (misaligned eyes) and cataracts. All of these conditions if left undetected can or may lead to Amblyopia (blurred or lazy eye). Amblyopia can be successfully treated if detected early.

The screening requires no physical contact with your child, parents can hold the child during the screening and poses no risk to their health. A trained technician will conduct the vision screen, and you will be notified of the results. This is to be considered a preliminary procedure, and does not constitute a diagnosis of vision problems. The costs of this program are being covered by the Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation.

Benefits of Amblyopia Vision Screenings

- All screenings are performed by trained technicians
- Screenings are completely non-invasive
- Screenings will not disrupt classes, technicians require just a darkened room and two to three minutes of a child's time
- The Foundation will provide educational materials and consent forms for parents to sign prior to the screening
- All children screened receive a results card
- Parents are encouraged to schedule an eye exam if any vision abnormalities are found.
- At our last screening, 4 children were referred and all needed glasses to correct a found condition. It is so much easier on a child to have the problem corrected before they fall behind due to a vision problem.

We encourage anyone with a child 6 months to 6 years in the Linn Co. R-1 District to contact the school and let us know that you would like for your child to participate in this free vision screening. The Lions will be here at 12:30 pm on March 7th. If you know any children 6 months to 6 years that live in the district please have them call to set up an appointment. College Visit Days

Seniors! Don't forget you have two college visit days to use this year. Make plans to use them to tie up any loose ends before you graduate. In order for them to count as visit days, the correct forms must be completed and turned into me before you leave!

Receiving Scholarships

If you have received any scholarship, make sure you let me know so you can be recognized at the awards assembly and at graduation. This includes scholarships that the college itself awards you. You deserve the recognition, let it be known! Understanding the financial aid process can be hard, and you may not know where to turn for answers. The financial aid section of each college's website is a good starting point. If you don't find answers there, call the financial aid office. Here are 15 questions to ask:

- 1. What types of financial assistance do you offer: need-based, merit-based, or both?
- 2. Can you provide an early estimate of what my student's financial aid award might be?
- 3. If my child doesn't qualify for need-based aid, what alternative financing options are available?
- 4. What percentage of your student population receives financial aid?
- 5. How much does an average student owe on student loans when he/she graduates?
- 6. What forms are needed in order to apply for financial aid?
- 7. When are financial aid applications due?
- 8. What costs for my student are considered by the financial aid office?
- 9. What is included in the comprehensive fee?
- 10. When will my student be notified about the amount of assistance he or she can expect?
- 11. Is there a commitment for financial assistance beyond the first year?
- 12. If not, how and when does my student apply for financial assistance after the first year?
- 13. What grants, loans, and work-study opportunities does the college offer?
- 14. Can my student apply financial aid toward an off-campus study program, either in the US or another country?
- 15. What happens if our family's financial situation changes substantially during the school year?

SAR & EFC: Student Aid Report & Expected Family Contribution

Student Aid Report (SAR) Intro:

After completing your FAFSA, you should receive your SAR in 1-3 days if you filed electronically or 2-3 weeks if you filed a paper version. Check immediately for: EFC (upper right pg 1) and any mistakes or errors (pgs 5-8).

What is the Student Aid Report:

The SAR is a summary of the information you entered on the FAFSA. The SAR also notifies you of your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and if you are eligible for a Pell Grant.

Why is the SAR important:

Your SAR is the form that tells you how much student aid you are eligible to receive from the federal government, and how much the government expects your family to pay.

What happens after I receive my SAR:

Immediately check for any mistakes or errors. Any colleges you listed on your FAFSA will also receive a copy of your SAR. Notify your prospective school's aid office immediately to make corrections. A delay could mean less aid.

What if I don't receive my SAR?

Call 1-800-433-3243 if you do not receive your SAR in 3-4 weeks.

Highlights of each page of the SAR:

(1). Intro: tracks the aid process for you. (2). Confidentiality info: includes other formal reminders. (3). EFC, other info: EFC is listed at the top, along with other information, such as issues affecting your aid eligibility. (4). Summary of loans: as a high school student, you probably do not have any loans yet. If you haven't taken out any loans, the totals should read zero. (5-8) FAFSA Summary: review the summary. Make corrections or changes in the spaces provided. You can also make changes online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. *How is the EFC calculated:*

The US Department of Education uses the Federal Methodology to calculate your aid eligibility. The FM takes into account: your family's income, the number of family members (in college or not), net value of assets, and your enrollment status, among other factors.

Why is there an asterisk next to my EFC:

It means you have been selected for verification and must provide documents to your prospective college(s) to verify the information submitted on the FAFSA. About 1 in 3 are selected. If there is no asterisk, you have not been selected.

What should I do if I was selected for verification:

If your college asks for verifying documents, send them as soon as possible to avoid a delay in the aid process.
