The MIM Leadership Team met from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on September 26, 2011 at Linn County R-1 School. The team reviewed the 2011 Summer MIM Conference and scheduled progress monitoring. Progress monitoring dates are: November 28th, January 23rd, March 26th, and April 30th. The February meeting will be on February 27th. There was discussion on data team training. It was decided to focus on training after Christmas since we are currently involved in unwrapping power standards to the Common Core State Standards (CCSS).

The new action plan for the upcoming year was reviewed, and there was discussion on the implementation of the items in the new plan. There are webinars available for A+ Learn Anywhere and Study Island training for staff. The students from last year need to be graduated, and third grade students need to be added to Study Island. The Northeast RPDC will be contacted to schedule trainings for our half day Professional Development days. There was discussion about the Common Core State Standards. The goal for having all power standards aligned to the CCSS and unwrapped is December 2011. Rigor is going up for these new standards. Kindergarten and first grade teachers should already be looking at the standards, as their students will be the first classes to take the assessment that will be developed.

The next meeting will be October 24th. The team will plan for the November meeting and choose staff surveys for the year. The team will

also be preparing for the regional MIM meeting on November 2nd. Our Leadership team will be hosting this meeting at the Linneus Community Center.

### **PLC**

The PLC committee met with members from Truman RPDC in September. This meeting helped the Leadership team gain a focus for the 2011-2012 school year. The day was spent working on MAP/EOC data that the faculty will use to guide instruction. The PLC Leadership team attended a regional meeting held at Truman in October. The training included listening to many other PLC schools present various activities that were taking place in their schools. We were able to pick up several good ideas to bring back to our school. The PLC leadership team has also been busy preparing for the professional development day on October 19th.

The Linn County R-1 teaching staff met on 10/19/11 and the meeting was opened with a discussion about a listening survey that was sent out to teachers. The faculty and staff also discussed collective commitments that will show our commitment to the Linn County R-1 Mission and Vision statements. The faculty and staff worked on district smart goals for math and communication arts. After finishing with the smart goals, the teachers met with their collaborative teams to work on aligning power standards with the new Common Core State Standards.

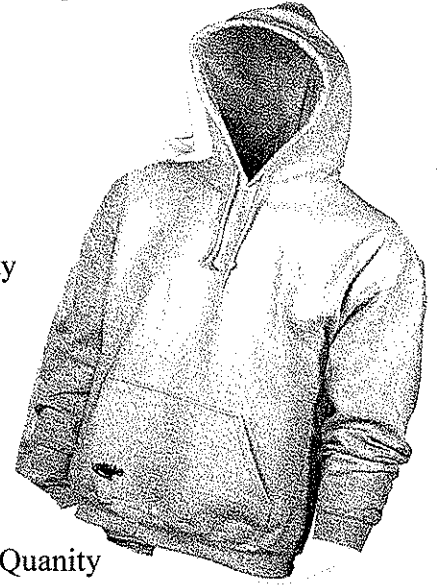
