Trauma-Informed Schools Initiative

Pursuant to Missouri Senate Bill 638, Section 161.1050, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) has established the "Trauma-Informed Schools Initiative."

For the purposes of this initiative, the following terms are defined as follows:

"Trauma-informed approach" - an approach that involves understanding and responding to the symptoms of chronic interpersonal trauma and traumatic stress across the lifespan

"Trauma-informed school" - a school that: a. realizes the widespread impact of trauma and understands potential paths for recovery

 b. recognizes the signs and symptoms of trauma in students, teachers and staff
 c. responds by fully integrating knowledge about trauma into its policies, procedures and practices; and

d. seeks to actively resist re-traumatization

Halloween Party Information

It's hard to believe, but it is almost time for Halloween. This letter is to inform you of the procedures for the elementary Halloween celebration at school this year. In recent years, we have asked for the students to not dress up as gory characters or in gory costumes (no blood, no weapons, etc.). We are going to ask that of them this year also. It is great to see the fairytale characters, cartoon characters and all the different costumes the students create with their imagination. We appreciate your help and support in keeping the gory costumes out of the school building.

The party will be on Friday, October 28th. The beginning time will be 1:30 p.m. We ask that the parents not go into the classrooms or pull students out of any classrooms until 1:30 p.m. At 1:30 p.m. the students can begin getting their costumes on. The classes will then go into the gym and be seated by 1:45 p.m. The students will parade the gym as usual. The children not yet in school will parade first, and then we will work our way up by grade level. After every grade level has paraded the gym, the students will be dismissed to parade the high school hallways. On departure from the gym, each student will receive a Halloween treat. Immediately following the parading of the high school hallways, the elementary students will have their classroom parties. There is an important move toward health
