Revised Immunization Requirements for Children Enrolled in School and Day Care

Effective beginning the 2010-2011 school year the following new requirements will be implemented:

- •A second dose of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine for all children entering kindergarten. If the child has had chicken pox disease, a licensed physician may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the date of disease. Parental statement will no longer be accepted as proof of disease.
- •Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, accelular perussis) vaccine will be required for all incoming eighth (8th) grade students if the child has completed the childhood DTaP vaccination series, and has not received a Td booster within the past two years. Any student in grades nine through twelve who have not had a 10 year Td/Tdap booster, should have the recommended Tdap for the catch up booster.
- •Age appropriate pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) will be required for children attending daycare, preschool, and nursery schools caring for 10 or more children.
- •Physician documentation of chickenpox disease will be required for child care facilities. Parental statements will no longer be acceptable beginning July 1, 2010.

All required vaccines are available at the Linn Co. Health Department. If a family has access to vaccines though their private health care provider or a Federally qualified health center, vaccines should be obtained through these sources. The Linn Co. Health Department will be here April 8, 2010 at Linn Co. R-1 for a free Tdap clinic for incoming 8th grade students.





MIM Notes March 8, 2010

The March 8th MIM Leadership team meeting was held at the Purdin Community Center at 11:45 am. The purpose of the half day meeting was to complete the self-study review which has to be uploaded to the MIM website by May 15th. The discussion on the self-study began where the team left off from the last meeting. The self-study was completed and Mrs. Ward will enter the data into the form to be uploaded.

The Leadership team began the discussion on the Action Plan for the 2010-2011 school year. The action plan for the 2009-2010 school year was reviewed. It was decided to amend action step 1 under the smart goal to read K-8 instead of K-5. Step 2 would be continued to be implemented and on step 4 targets on aimsweb need to be adjusted. The team discussed sustaining the formal problem solving process.

The team broke into small groups to discuss SMART GOALS. A SMART GOAL that was discussed in detail was: 80% of K-8 students will master Communication Arts and Math power standards at the universal level by 2013. Some action steps that were discussed to go with this SMART GOAL were progress monitoring through benchmarking, creating and implementing common assessments, continuing PLC trainings, continued staff development and data meetings. The team will continue to discuss universal behavior screening.

During the next two meetings the team will work on budgets, SMART GOAL for behavioral screening, action planning and progress monitoring. The next MIM meeting will be held on Monday, March 29th in room 1 at the school and will take place beginning at 3:20 p.m.


