BOARD ELECTION

The Linn County Board of Education has its annual election on April 5, 2011. The election this year will be for three board seats. The seats are presently held by Tom Creason, Dean Sayre, and Trevor Stillwell.

Membership to the board is open to residents of the Linn County R-I District who have resided in the state for one year prior to the election, and are at least twenty-four years of age. Candidates must be citizens of the United States and resident taxpayers of the District.

To run for a seat on the board an individual must file for office. The Board filing dates are between Dec. 14, 2010 and Jan. 18, 2011. Filing is in the superintendent's office between 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM Monday through Friday and until 5:00 PM on January 18, 2011.

The district's offices will be closed at 12:00 on December 23, 2010, and all day on December 24, 2010, Thursday afternoon December 30, 2010 and all day on December 31, 2010. Therefore, on the mentioned dates, we will not be accepting candidates filing.



PLC

The PLC committee met on October 12, 2010 to plan for the Professional Development Meeting that will be held Wednesday, October 20, 2010. Candi Ward presented a rough draft of the Linn County R-1 Vision Statement. The PD will begin with a discussion regarding this rough draft. At the conclusion of the discussion, it is hoped that we will have a finalized Vision Statement. Next slides will be presented to define Power Standards. Teachers will come prepared with CA Power Standards for elementary and subject standards for middle/high school. In our core data teams, teachers will review their standards for Readiness, Leverage, Endurance, and Test. Time will be given to have data teams assess standards and work on vertical alignment. Gaps and overlapping will be noted and adjustments made to power standards. Groups will then share their findings to the entire staff. Our Problem Solving Process will be reviewed for past staff and introduced to new staff members. Charity will model how she uses it. Each teacher will be given a copy of the process for their binders. Shelly will have exit slips prepared. Mr. Livingston has agreed to let everyone leave at 3:00.

PLC meeting October 20, 2010 Linn County R-1 Gymnasium

Teaching staff met on 10/20/10 and the meeting was opened with Mrs. Ward discussing the vision statement. Suggestions from previous meetings were put on a form for more discussion from the groups. Groups suggested revisions and the forms were collected by Mrs. Ward. She will retype the revision suggestions and email those out to all staff.

Mrs. Ward discussed what Power Standards were and how they were to be used. A handout was provided with all the expectations of a Power Standard. The groups worked on labeling the standards with: Readiness; Leverage; Endurance; State test; and work was done on vertical aligning standards with different grade levels.

Mrs. Banko discussed data conversation procedures and shared an example with the staff. Handouts were given for future reference and use by teachers.

Coach Rex passed out exit slips to all staff and the meeting was adjourned. The next PLC meeting will be held November 17, 2010.

MIM (Missouri Integrated Model)

The MIM Leadership team met with Dr. Kim Harding in attendance. Dr. Harding is a new ½ time MIM facilitator.

The team's discussion points were the school improvement plan for the elementary. Some of the ideas for the school improvement plan for the elementary were to hire a consultant to look for improvement within the classrooms, work on differentiated instruction strategies, and build a data team.

There was discussion on making sure MIM action plan fit into the PD calendar.

Mrs. Ward will share one of our improvements at the Regional Meeting on October 25.

Next meeting will be held on November 22 at 3:30 in Room 1. Anyone is welcome to attend.
