# Mrs. Banko

What's your education? Bachelor of Science in Elementary with an Emphasis in Early Childhood education from Missouri Western State University and a Master of Science in Administration through William Woods University.

What is your experience? I taught 4th grade at St. James Catholic School for 1 year, 2nd grade at St. James Catholic School for 1 year, and 2nd grade at Linn County R-1 for 16 years.

Why did you choose to teach? I fell into education by simply walking by the childcare facility at Missouri Western on my way to work at the fitness center. I had to walk by the playground from the criminal justice building to the fitness center. The children always were having a great time playing and their teachers seemed like they were enjoying themselves too. I enjoyed my criminal justice classes but they were not very hands-on at the time and I felt that I wanted a profession that can help people before they are in the criminal system. I took education classes for a semester and enjoyed all of them so I switched majors the next semester.

Why did you choose Linn County? When I completed my 2 year obligation to St. James, I applied at every school in Linn Co. I received call backs from all of them and interviewed with Linn Co first. I liked the interview process with a more personal interview style rather than with a team that other schools used. I also liked that at the time we were under the reading grant that would offer a structured routine to reading instruction. When I got the call back for a second grade split grade, it was exactly what I wanted. I called the other schools to let them know I had accepted the contract and the rest is history.

If your child/children plan on attending summer school, please send this form back by April 12th. This date is important because we will need a count to determine whether summer school is feasible or not.

Sign up now. Summer school will focus on Reading and Math, but other fun activities will also be incorporated into summer school. Summer school will begin on Wednesday, May 25th and end on Tuesday, June 14th. NO SCHOOL on Monday, May 30th (Memorial Day).

The students will attend school from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. each day with the exception of **Tuesday**, **June 14<sup>th</sup>**. On that day, we will travel to Chillicothe to play in the park, eat lunch, and then swim at the Chillicothe Aquatic Center. We will return around 4:00 p.m. that day.
