Parents As Teachers Missouri Curriculum Partner

The Parents As Teachers program has taken on some changes for the 2022-23 school year. We will still use the Parents As Teachers National Center curriculum but it has been streamlined to better serve the families of Missouri. They have changed the Missouri's name to Parents as Teachers Missouri Curriculum Partner and is under the Early Childhood Development Act (ECDA).

We hope to increase parents' confidence and parenting skills. Parents can then better support their children's education and development so their children will be safe, healthy, and ready to learn before and after kindergarten entry. The results from periodic developmental screenings can increase parents' understanding of their children's progress, as well as inform them of any possible delays. When developmental delays can be addressed through early intervention, children are more likely to be ready for school. The parent education and developmental screening program was created by the ECDA and is designed to prepare children, families, schools, and communities toward school readiness.

The four components of the program:

- (1) family personal visits
- (2) developmental screenings
- (3) group connections,
- (4) a resource network. These components are integral in supporting school readiness.

The program promotes early learning, knowledge and understanding of child development, partnerships between families and schools, and access to community resources. These opportunities assist families with a smooth transition into preschool and kindergarten, which support school readiness.

Required Papers to Participate in MSHSAA Recognized Activities and Drug — Testing Policy

Instead of an athletic meeting this year, the drug testing policy and concussion information will be included in each student's beginning of the year informational folder. It will be mandatory that all forms are signed by a parent/guardian and the student and turned in before a student will be allowed to participate in a competition. ACADEMIC OPTIONS ---First Semester Fall 2022

This is an online-only option we are offering for students from across the Linn County R-1 School District. It will include an online educational platform provided by out of District educators. These students will not be on campus during the school day for activities like celebrations or participation in athletic events.

- -Parents and students will communicate with Educere educators
- -Students will not be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities
- -Students will be committed to online learning for an entire semester (August -December)
