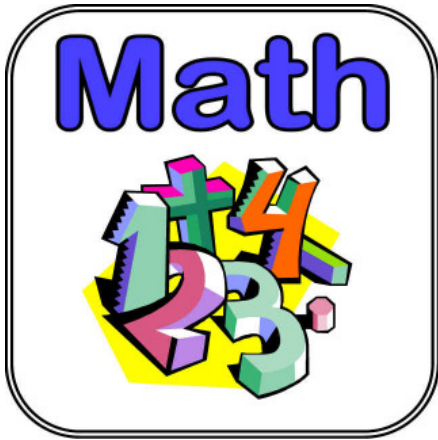
Summer School
