Don't forget fall fundraiser items are scheduled to be delivered to the school 11/30. They will be ready for student delivery.





We will use virtual learning in a modified schedule whenever bad weather days are predicted and we can prepare students with the tools needed for instruction. When using an AMI day, we are considered to be in school and would not have to make up the day.

BOARD ELECTION

The Linn Co. R-I School District encourages qualified persons interested in running for a position on the School Board to file to be a candidate in the April 2nd, 2024 election. Interested persons may file at the superintendent's office. Filing will begin on Tuesday, December 5, 2023, at 8:00 a.m. and will continue during the district's regular business hours, which are Tuesday through Friday from 7:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Except for the first and last day of filing, filing will not occur on days that the school district's central offices are closed due to inclement weather. Filing will also not occur on the following holidays and breaks when the school district's central offices are closed: December 20 (after 12pm), 21 and 22 (all day).

Filing will end on Tuesday, December 26, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.
